

THERE IS NO HUMAN RIGHT TO USE DRUGS

The argument against drug use as a "human right" is not just legal or political - it is an ethical responsibility. Ethical reasoning shows that their choices contribute to larger societal consequences. For example, drug use, even recreational use, is not only self-destructive but also socially irresponsible, making it an act against the collective good.

Not enough people acknowledge that the illicit drug trade and drug trafficking is being financed in order to destroy the free world. Drugs are used by people, including terrorists, in order to commit crimes such as murder, including decapitation, rape, treason, torture, the trafficking of children, and to spread fear all over the world.

Drug cartels finance hate fuelled groups. These groups are now infiltrating and warring against Western and other societies. This will require government action in every country, to defend their citizens.

At the grassroots level, drugs destroy families and, as a result, our society.

Gang-members fight for their territory in towns, killing people, blowing up buildings and terrifying populations.

Global drug abuse is supported by the corruption and power of drug trade money and the weakness of many national leaders and institutions, who think drug taking is a human right. However, they disregard the public's right to live in a safe environment, free from the predations of drug pushers and their criminality. They also disregard the public's right to live free of harm, where drug users inflict unacceptable harms (the reason we have 'harm reduction' programs for drug users) on their partners, children, their children's grandparents, siblings, friends, workmates and the community in general.
